Naturalness with character

Parquet is a genuinely natural product. No two trees are alike: Growing conditions, location, climate and age leave their own unique traces in the wood. This natural variety is reflected later in the appearance of the parquet planks. Each individual plank is unique, much like a person's fingerprint. Depending on the structure of the wood, parquet planks appear calmer or more lively, more even or particularly distinctive. That's why the raw material is graded according to visual characteristics even before the planks are produced. The aim is to create a harmonious overall appearance with the installed floor – from

calm and elegant to lively, rustic and expressive. These visual properties of the parquet flooring are referred to as grading criteria. They describe features such as grain, knot content, colour differences or natural growth features of the wood. We use these criteria to assign our parquet floors to specific categories, such as Markant or Sauvage. As wood is a natural material and each plank has its own history, these features cannot be standardised. Instead, they move within a defined range – in terms of frequency, size and degree. That's exactly what makes parquet so appealing: a floor that combines naturalness, individuality and character.
